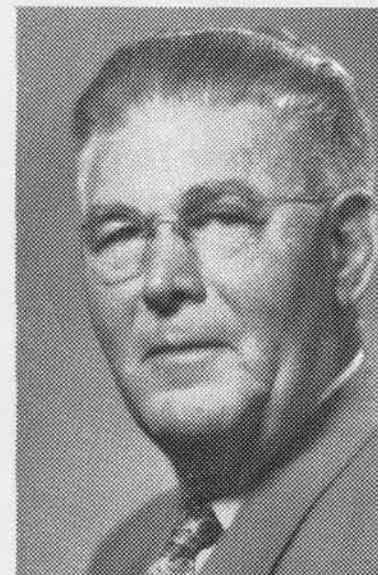
GEORGE H. SAUER—Baylor's youthful head football coach and Athletic Director—brings a brilliant nine-year coaching record and a sensational player past in his inaugural season in the Southwest Conference. Formerly, the ex-Nebraska All-American fullback had coached New Hampshire, Kansas and Navy, before accepting the dual post at Baylor late last January.

In his first seven terms as a head gridiron mentor, George Sauer produced three conference champs, (one at New Hampshire in his first year and two at Kansas). During those seven years, Sauer's record was 38 wins, 19 losses and five ties. The roughest schedule of the nation for two years at Navy has made his present record 41-wins, 32 losses and seven ties.

Born Dec. 11, 1910, the personable coach calls Lincoln, Nebraska home. In high school there he was a four sport star. Under Dana X. Bible he earned All Big Six fullback honors three consecutive years, 1931-32-33. During World War II, Sauer served as a Naval Officer, 18 months of his time being spent aboard the carrier Enterprise.

It didn't take the Bruin rein-master long to become personally acquainted with every prospect on the roster after he began his duties last Spring. He is patient to develop the best potentialities in his players, and doesn't like losers. Praise from the game-loving coach is a treasured honor for the Bears, and while he stresses, "It's a team—no stars," he won't miss the opportunity to point out a touch of greatness in one of his pupils.

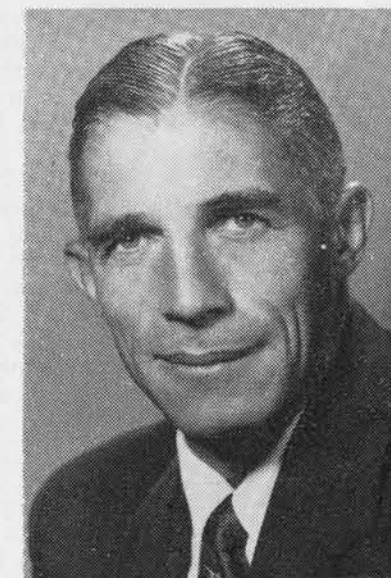

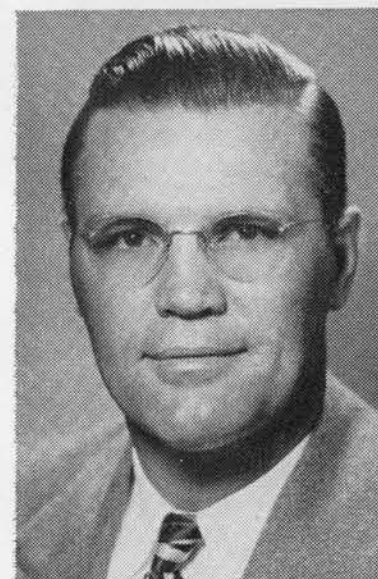

BAYLOR COACHES

FLOYD A. "Uncle Jim" CROW has served in every capacity on the Bear coaching staff during his 30 years of continuous service. For his kindness and human understanding, "Uncle Jim" is one of the most beloved characters in Baylor history.

Besides being Assistant Athletic Director, Uncle Jim is chief scout for Baylor football teams. He is not only one of the Southwest's greatest scouts, but is recognized nationally.

He came to Baylor in 1920 after four years of immortal tackle play at Texas A&M and four years in World War I.

* * *

R. E. "Bill" HENDERSON is better known for masterminding Baylor cage quintets into national prominence. Four of his last five hardwood aggregations have finished first in the SWC. "Bill" has also been one of the strategists responsible for Bruin grid victories since 1936. This year he doubles as end coach. At Temple, Texas, High School he coached such football greats as Baylor's Botchey Kock (All-American guard, 1930), and Sammy Baugh. At Howard Payne he earned four letters in football, four in basketball and three in baseball and was elected captain of all three sports.

AUGUST M. "Mike" MICHALSKE was an immediate favorite with the Bruin forward wall prospects when he joined the staff last Spring. With his deep bass voice but quiet manner, Line Coach Mike stresses fundamentals to the limit.

His own football record is one of the most colorful in the country. For three years he was a versatile star at Penn State, playing guard, tackle, fullback and center. For the professional New York Yankees and Green Bay Packers Mike was a guard, six of his nine years being highlighted by All-Pro selection.

Born in Cleveland, Ohio, Mike celebrated his 44th birthday last April. His past coaching experience is seven seasons as head mentor at Iowa State and two years as line coach of the Baltimore Colts.

BACKFIELD COACH H. V. "Vic" BRADFORD has been teamed with head coach Sauer since service days as a player-coach at St. Marys Pre-Flight. In 1938, "Vic" quarterbacked Alabama to the Rose Bowl, but turned down play-for-pay football to go into baseball. His career with the New York Giants was cut short by World War II. Twice while at Alabama Vic was voted the "Outstanding Crimson Tide Athlete."

At Baylor he has taken up the tutelage of the diamond nine in addition to football coaching. Formerly a Naval Lieutenant, Bradford is a native of Memphis, Tenn.

JACK WILSON has the double duties of football assistant and head track coach. One of Baylor's all-time great halfbacks from 1939-41, Jack played for two years with Los Angeles Rams after discharge from the Army.

The ex-Bear captain joined the coaching staff at Baylor in 1948. His principle job for 1950 is setting the secondary defense.

FRESHMAN COACH SAM BOYD is the most recent addition to the coaching staff. Another former Bruin grid captain, Sam graduated in 1939 after two years of All-Southwest end play. Before entering the Navy during World War II, Sam played football for the Pittsburgh Steelers. Now 35, Sam is a native of Cleburne, Texas.

Baylor Trainer and Sports News Director

Delmer Brown, Baylor's athletic trainer, is beginning his fourth year at Baylor. At North Texas State "Doc" was an all-time, all-America cinderman. He and twin brother Elmer joined Wayne and Blaine Rideout in establishing two world's relay marks that still stand. Delmer also was holder of the world 220 yard dash record until Jesse Owens set the present mark.

Last summer, Brown was guest instructor on training techniques at coaching schools in New Mexico and Arizona. Brown is married and has three children.

DUB KING
Sports News Director

Dub King joined Baylor 30 days ago. King's wide experience in newspaper, radio and athletic fields qualifies him for the position of athletic news director of the fastest growing athletic organization in the Southwest. King grew up in Fort Worth; worked ten years as a sports reporter for the Fort Worth Star Telegram. During his 42 months in the army, he served as a foot soldier, coach of championship basketball and baseball teams and as editor of the Camp Wolters newspaper.

Before coming to Baylor, King was sports news director at Texas A and M. Last spring, Dub was named on the Helms Foundation's team of all-America college publicity men, being the only man in the Southwest to achieve this honor. King is married and has a daughter aged five and a two-year old son.

Today's Game

Today's game between the Rice Owls and Baylor Bears marks the 31st time these old rivals have met in college football competition.

Their very first game was a thriller with the Owls squeezing past the Bruins, 14-13. Since then, each team has enjoyed equal success in the series. In fact, they enter today's game all even—Rice has won 14 games, Baylor has won 14 games and two of the games ended in 7-7 ties. It is one of the few remaining Southwest Conference series in which no "touchdown-less" games have resulted. One of the teams involved always scores a touchdown. The Bears have scored four shutouts in the series with Rice gaining six shutouts.

Baylor's last victory over Rice came on a field goal, 17-14, back in 1945. But in 1946 the Baptists gave the dope bucket a hard kick by playing the Houstonians to a 7-7 deadlock.
