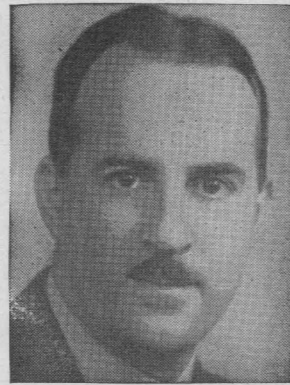

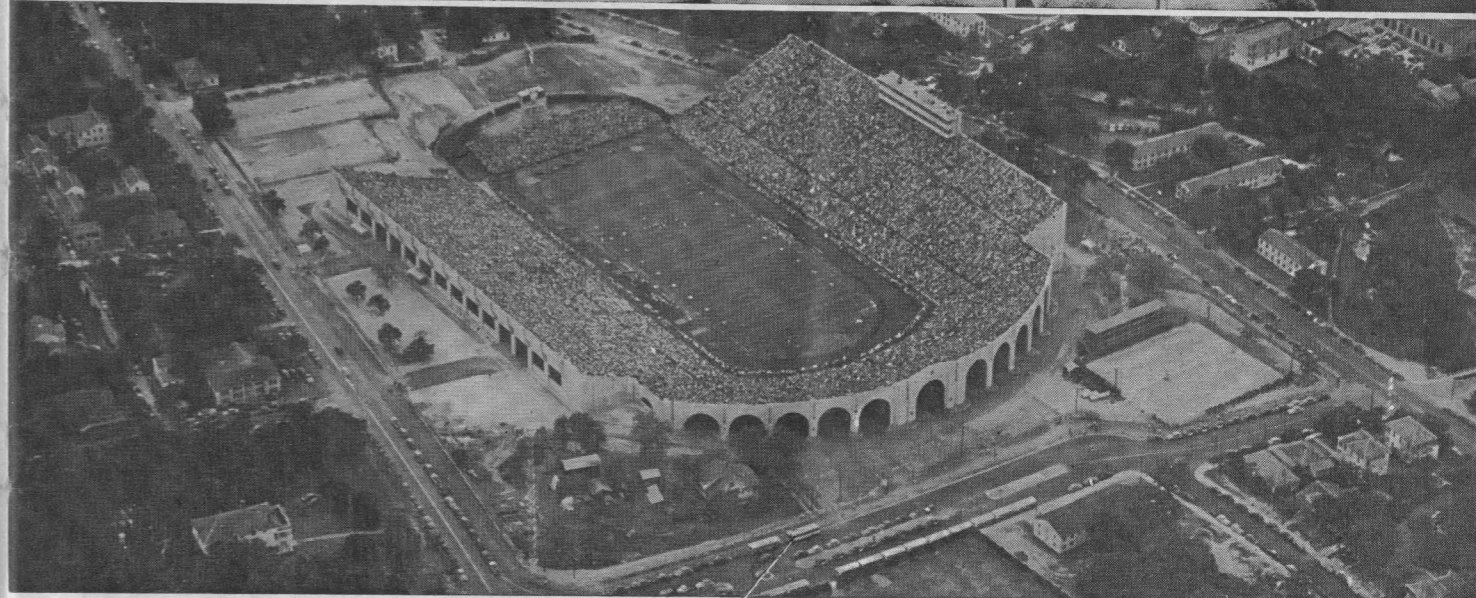

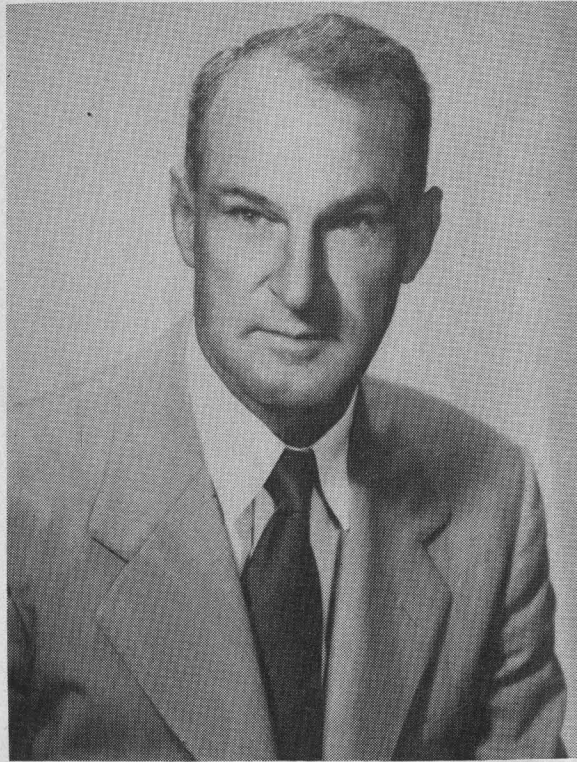

# RICE STAFF

## HEAD FOOTBALL COACH JESS NEELY



One of the veterans of the collegiate coaching profession, Jess Neely of Rice Institute has compiled an outstanding record in that field.

He has been a coach for 28 years, and a head coach and athletic director in the major collegiate athletic ranks for 20 years. As a head coach, Neely's grid teams at Clemson College in South Carolina and Rice Institute in Texas have won 112 games, lost 75, and tied 11.

This successful .644 winning percentage was compiled despite Neely's only below-.500 years at Rice during the World War II seasons of '43, '44, and '45 when the Owls' manpower was very low and 19 games were lost in just three seasons.

The Neely coaching career to date:

1923—head coach at Murfreesboro (Tennessee) High School

1924-27—assistant coach, Southwestern University at Memphis, Tenn.

1928—(spring and summer) assistant baseball coach at Princeton U.

1928-30—end coach at University of Alabama under Wallace Wade

1931-39—head coach and athletic director at Clemson College

1940—head coach and athletic director at Rice Institute

The 1951 Rice football team is Neely's twelfth at the school, which establishes him as the dean of all Owl head football coaches in the point of service. His record at Rice through eleven seasons is 69 victories, 40 defeats, and 4 ties.

Three Neely-coached teams have played in major bowl games. Each was victorious.

## HEAD FOOTBALL COACH EDWIN B. PRICE



Appointment of Edwin Booth Price as head football coach of The University of Texas gives the school a full slate of ex-students serving as head coaches in the major sports.

Price lettered in three sports at Texas—football, basketball and baseball—and has the distinction of having played on a conference championship team in each sport, an achievement unmatched in the University's history. He was an end on the 1930-31-32 football teams, captain and all-conference guard on the 1933 championship basketball team and an infielder on the 1931-32-33 baseball teams. (The 1930 football team and the 1932 baseball team won conference championships.) Price earned a total of eight letters in the three sports, three each in basketball and football.

Price took a bachelor of arts degree in 1933 and a master's degree in education in 1939. He began his coaching career at Hillsboro High School and Hillsboro Junior College in 1933. In 1934 he went to El Paso High School, and then to Austin of El Paso the following year.

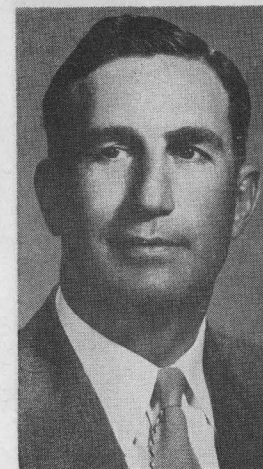
He returned to the University in 1936, working with three sports, the ones in which he had lettered, and interposing scouting duties. He left for naval duty in 1942 with the major part of his service done on an aircraft carrier in the Pacific, including the Philippines campaign. He returned to the University late in 1945.

Price was promoted to varsity line coach in 1947, when Blair Cherry succeeded Dana X. Bible as head coach. In the four seasons in that capacity he has done a great job of developing outstanding lines, this year's two-platoon lines ranking with the nation's best. Like Cherry did when he moved up to head coach, Price is turning to a different formation. His 1951 Longhorns will use the split-T.

Price was a four-sport letterman at Corsicana High School, finishing there in 1929. He made the all-state basketball team while in school there.

Price was born January 12, 1909, at Brownwood, Texas . . . He is married and has two children—Patricia, 5, and Danny, 4.

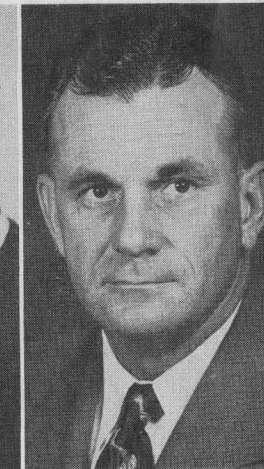

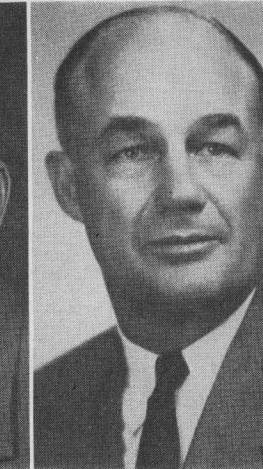
**J. T. KING**

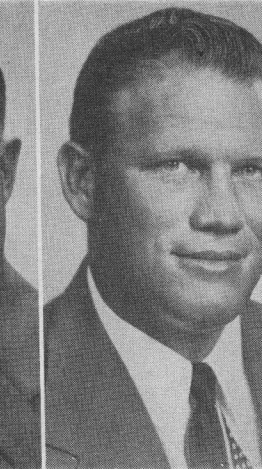
**ECK CURTIS**

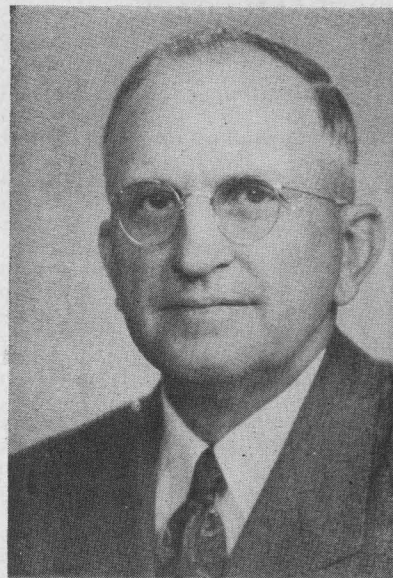


**H. C. (BULLY) GILSTRAP**  
Assistant Coach  
Former Longhorn star in football, basketball, track . . . played end on Texas' last undefeated football team (1923) . . . coached for 12 years at Schreiner Institute . . . returned to Texas in 1937, when Bible took over the athletic department reins . . . married, one son.



**BUDDY JUNGMICHEL**  
Assistant Coach  
Has been on the football staff at his alma mater for four seasons, serving as freshman coach and doubling as scout for the varsity . . . a star guard on Texas' great 1941 team . . . played service ball, then one year for Miami in professional ranks . . . married, one daughter.

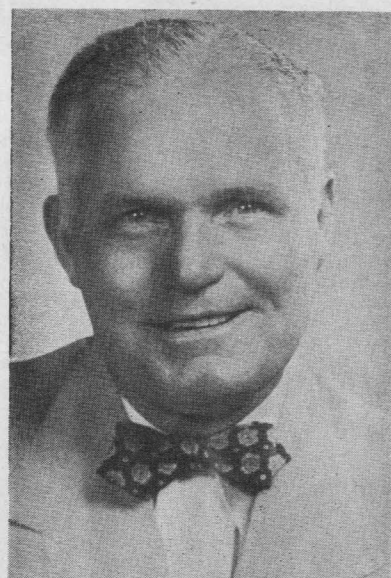
# OTHER U. T. HEAD COACHES



**CLYDE LITTLEFIELD**  
Track

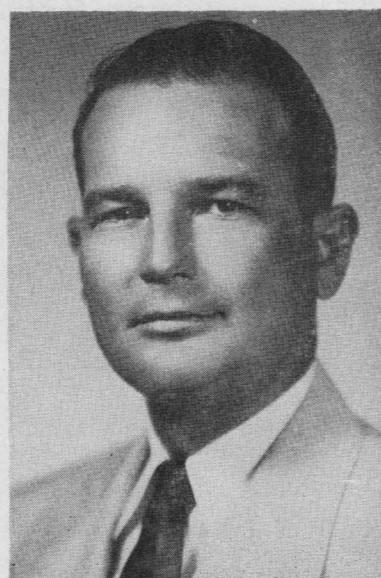
CROSS COUNTRY

Dean of Southwest Conference track coaches, Littlefield has achieved phenomenal success at Texas, winning eighteen SWC championships and finishing in the runner-up spot ten times . . . He has developed many great track men but is best known for his record-breaking sprint relay teams which hold the 440-relay record at all but one of the nation's big relay meets . . . The veteran track coach is past president of the National Collegiate Track Coaches Association and a member of the Olympic and Pan-American Games committees.



**BIBB FALK**  
Baseball

One of the most colorful athletes ever developed at the University of Texas, Falk became head baseball coach in 1940 . . . During his eleven seasons in the major leagues (eight with the Cleveland Indians, three with the Chicago White Sox), he compiled a lifetime batting average of .312 . . . He has produced many fine baseball teams at Texas, the greatest being the 1949 and 1950 aggregations which captured NCAA championships . . . Falk's Longhorn nines have also won seven Southwest Conference titles and shared an eighth in nine attempts.



**THURMAN B. HULL**  
Basketball

Most recent addition to the University's coaching staff is Thurman B. "Blue" Hull, who succeeds Jack Gray as basketball coach . . . An outstanding cager at Texas from 1939 to 1941, he compiled a fine record (36-12) during his two seasons of coaching at Temple High School . . . Moving to Lamar College in 1948, he continued his winning ways as his teams won 46 and lost 31 during his three seasons at the Beaumont school . . . During World War II, he tutored the Fort Monmouth, N. J. squad to the Army-Navy championship.



**DR. D. A. PENICK**  
Tennis

University of Texas tennis squads have been tutored by Dr. Penick for more than half a century . . . Under his direction, the Longhorns have dominated the Southwest Conference, winning the only four team titles awarded, 26 of the 36 doubles crowns and 22 of the 36 singles championships . . . Texas also captured two national collegiate singles and five doubles titles under Dr. Penick's guidance.



**HARVEY PENICK**  
Golf

Boasting one of the highest winning percentages among the nation's collegiate golf coaches, Harvey has guided the Longhorns' links fortunes for 21 years . . . During this period, his golfers have copped the Southwest Conference team title 18 times and the individual championship 15 times . . . A cousin of Dr. Penick, the tennis coach, he has also produced one national champ and three runners-up.



**HENRY CHAPMAN**  
Swimming

A Southwest Conference diving champion at Texas in 1940, "Hank" joined the Texas coaching staff last year and promptly developed a championship team, Texas' 19th in 20 years of SWC swimming competition . . . Before returning to his alma mater, he tutored the Baylor swimmers for three seasons . . . Also serves as member of the University physical training staff.

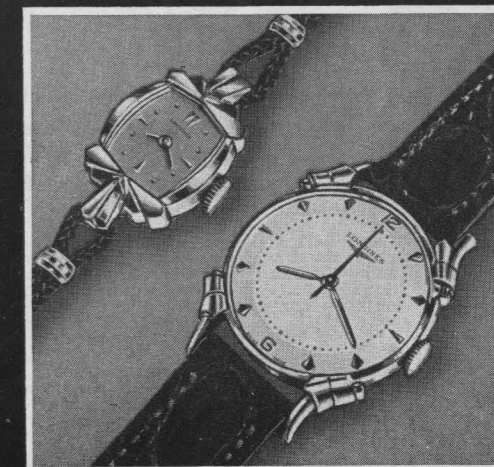

One of two sophomores to make the 1950 starting offensive lineup... lone regular returning from offensive line... rated all-America calibre by his coaches... caught 23 passes for 314 yards and one touchdown last season... was star fullback at Baytown High School but converted to end after freshman season... coaches figure he could make the squad at any position... posted more minutes (322) than any end on squad in '50... chosen on Houston Post all-SWC team last fall... called "Swede" by his mates... due for double duty this season... 20, 6-2, 210... No. 85.

**Stolhandske, Tom**  
RE—210

One of nation's best linebackers, selected on Associated Press all-America defensive team in '50... all-SWC on virtually all defensive selections... all-state center at Longview in 1947... defensive specialist... called "Tiger" by his mates because of his fierce tackling... spectacular player who tosses backs for frequent losses... worked as "roughneck" in oil fields during summer... senior... selected on one pre-season all-America team for 1951... physical education major... married... 22, 180, 6-1... No. 53.

**Menasco, Don**  
LE—180

Made several all-SWC selections last season... specialized on defense in '50 after being offensive regular as soph in '49... starred as fullback at Lufkin High School... was all-state tournament basketball in high school and made Dallas News all-state defensive football team as linebacker... senior... married... 22, 6-3, 205... No. 80.

**Williams, Paul**  
LE—205

Broken bone in right hand set him back in sophomore season but he was defensive regular in final games... was all-City Conference tackle in high school at Arlington Heights (Fort Worth)... also outstanding as hurdler in high school... one of the hardest players on squad to block... junior... 20, 195, 6-1... No. 87.

**Georges, Bill**  
LE—195

Nicknamed "Red," this former fullback is tallest player on squad at 6-5... outstanding punter at Baytown High School... excelled as kickoff man last fall... caught 4 passes for gain of 34 yards... capable baseball pitcher... married... senior... 21, 205, 6-5... No. 82.

**Adams, John**  
RE—205

Leading freshman receiver last fall, catching 13 passes for 215 yards and 2 touchdowns... rated one of top sophs on squad... starred at Lufkin High School... 18, 190, 6-1.

**Spring, Gilmer**

Came to Texas as T-quarterback and played that position as well as fullback and end last fall... averaged 11.6 yards on his five ball-carrying efforts in '50, caught 4 passes for 75 yards and one touchdown and completed one of three passes for seven yards... also won freshman numeral in baseball... from Abilene... 19, 195, 6-2.

Promising offensive tackle... played only 29 minutes as soph... gained high school experience at Arlington Heights (Fort Worth)... journalism major... 20, 6-2, 215... No. 71.

Shoulder injury limited his play as freshman last fall... missed spring practice... considered one of best soph prospects in line... moved to Texas from New Jersey... 20, 215, 6-3.

## GUARDS

Calls defensive signals... specializes on defense and is outstanding linebacker, one of best in SWC... converted from fullback... intercepted passes that set up touchdowns in games with Rice and Texas A&M last fall... logged more minutes (260) than any defensive lineman in '50... teamed with Jack Barton as linebackers at Denton High School... married... 21, 220, 6-0... No. 68.

**Davis, June**  
RG—220

Successor to All-America Bud McFadin at left guard... looked great in spring training... regular on defensive platoon as sophomore last fall... due double duty this fall... big deeds expected of him... played high school ball at St. Jo and came to Texas unheralded... 20, 220, 6-1... No. 66.

**Sewell, Harley**  
LG—220

Developed into first-rate tackle as a junior after mediocre sophomore season... very fast and agile, good at putting pressure on passer... has tossed shot near 50 feet and has placed in the event in SWC past two years... played at Austin High School... moved to guard to bolster offensive line this season... 21, 220, 6-3... No. 72.

**Milburn, Bill**  
RG—220

Another converted backfielder, he excelled as linebacker last season... nicknamed "Bulldog"... has earned two letters... played high school ball at Graham... shortest lineman on squad at 5-10... married... 22, 190, 5-10... No. 63.

**Cunningham, Don**  
LG—190

Expected to be regular offensive guard this fall after failing to letter for two seasons... excellent student... star tackle and goal kicker at Mount Vernon High School, where father is superintendent of schools... good blocker... understudied McFadin last season... member of National Guard... 22, 215, 6-2... No. 67.

**Fleming, Gene**  
LG—215

One of most spirited players on the squad, he has showed much improvement... very agile, he is good at putting pressure on passer... was teammate at Thomas Jefferson (SA) of Kyle Rote, SMU star of '50... pre-law student... 22, 195, 5-11... No. 65.

RG—195

Very aggressive and promising sophomore... excelled as blocker of punts at Austin High School in 1949... 19, 205, 6-0.

Football Writers Association gave him honorable mention for all-America defensive backfield last year and Stanley Woodward has named him to 1951 pre-season all-America... virtually unanimous choice on all-SWC defensive selections... returned punt 84 yards for deciding touchdown against Baylor; ran intercepted pass back 50 yards against Oklahoma to put Texas ahead, 13-7; returned intercepted pass against TCU for 46 yards and clinching touchdown, and raced back 50 yards with LSU punt... led SWC in punt return yardage and ranked third in nation... gained 134 yards in 30 rushing attempts... returned 15 punts 334 yards, three intercepted passes 91 yards... scored four touchdowns... ran 440 in 48 flat as sophomore... played high school ball at Temple... senior... has only one good eye (left)... married... 21, 180, 6-1...
